OHSAS 18001:2007/Z10-2005

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) aims to ensure worker safety and health in the United States. OSHA enforces standards and encourages continual improvement in workplace safety and health. Workplace inspections are one of OSHA's principal activities. In a recent year:

- 39,798 federal inspections were performed
- 83,562 federal violations were cited
- \$82,380,363 in penalties were levied

In addition to the federal inspections during the same time period, activities in states that administer their own plans included:

- 59,290 state inspections performed
- 144,075 violations cited
- \$71,310,017 in penalties levied

Over the next 5 years, OSHA's goal is to reduce the rate of workplace fatalities by at least 15% and workplace injuries and illnesses by at least 20%.

OHSAS 18001 is compatible with ISO 9001:2008 (Quality) and ISO 14001:2004 (Environmental) management system standards and addresses occupational health and safety rather than product and services safety.

The OHSAS specification provides requirements for an occupational health and safety management system to enable an organization to:

- Better manage occupational health and safety risks
- Continually improve worker protection
- Create a corporate culture that values worker safety as much as production and profit

The series is applicable to any company in any industry that wants to take a pro-active approach to reduce health and safety risks and was designed to help companies develop occupational health and safety policies/objectives and to set performance-based criteria for a managed safety and health system.

A documented health and safety management system can provide:

- A framework to identify health and safety issues and assess risk in the current workplace
- Methods to eliminate the identified issues and risks
- Methods to evaluate performance against set goals

The system should address legal requirements, all employees (part time and full time), and workplace visitors.
